#### International Overdose Awareness Day - August 31

Each year on August 31, we recognize International Overdose Awareness Day, a global event to remember those lost to drug overdose, support those grieving, and raise awareness about the impact of substance use and the importance of prevention.

At ACTS, we remain committed to providing compassionate, evidence-based treatment and support for individuals struggling with substance use. Overdose can affect anyone, and too often, stigma prevents people from seeking the help they need.

This day is a reminder:

- **To Remember:** We honor the lives of those lost to overdose and recognize the families and friends who continue to mourn.
- **To Raise Awareness:** Substance use disorder is a medical condition, not a moral failing. Overdose can happen to anyone.
- To Act: We advocate for expanded access to treatment, harm reduction tools like naloxone, and ongoing support for recovery.

ACTS offers a range of services—from detox and residential programs to mobile Medication Assisted Treatment and outpatient care. If you or someone you know needs support, help is available. Take a moment on August 31 to reflect, educate, and advocate. Together, we can reduce the stigma and help save lives.
